SAIL is a non-profit 501 (c) 3 corporation whose mission is to enable its members to remain active, connected, independent, and in their homes and community as long as possible.

SAIL is part of the "village movement" pioneered in Boston. We have created a community where members establish relationships, socialize, and help each other and the community. SAIL was the first "Village" in West Virginia and is recognized as a model for other non-urban villages nationwide. SAIL fills gaps in overburdened services for seniors and the disabled.

There are currently several hundred villages established or in development throughout the USA.

#### **Our Members**

SAIL members are like-minded people of diverse backgrounds. Some have lived here in Shepherdstown for generations; others arrived much more recently.

We are strong, independent, vote and pay taxes, and want to remain in our community, where we volunteer in our churches and service organizations. We patronize local businesses and attend classes at Shepherd University keeping our minds and bodies healthy.





#### Volunteering

There are ample opportunities to volunteer for SAIL:

- Assisting the office manager with mailings and managing office files and data input.
- Preparing newsletters and articles for the media and the website.
- Providing transportation to medical appointments and serving as a medical note taker.
- Running errands, providing a meal and making home visits to give a caregiver a break.
- Planning social and cultural events and organizing parties and dinners.
- Distributing SAIL literature and organizing "Coffee and Conversation" gatherings for prospective members.

- A single, trusted source to call for information, referrals, and resources.

# Eligibility

Anyone living within the geographic area, roughly within a 6-7 mile radius of Shepherdstown, is eligible. There is no minimum age requirement. (See map on website under membership)

#### Value

For a cost of \$250.00 per year for a single individual living alone and \$500.00 per household of two or more, members are entitled to all services and activities.
